

Always **supervise** children and ensure **materials are non-toxic and large** enough to avoid choking.

Provide open-ended projects to encourage creativity, such as "build your dream house" or "create a superhero mask."

Encourage more independence by letting them choose and combine materials.

Markers & Colored Pencils	Include fine-tipped washable markers for detailed coloring.
Stencils	Simple shapes or letters to help with tracing and pre- writing skills
Collage Materials	Add variety with sequins, small buttons, and glitter glue (with supervision).
Yarn & String	For weaving, threading, or wrapping crafts.
Hole Punch	Fun for punching patterns in paper.
Paper Rolls or Cardboard Tubes	For 3D projects like making binoculars or mini sculptures.
Rulers & Tape	For learning basic measuring and construction skills.
Playdough Accessories	Rolling pins, cookie cutters, and molds for creating shapes.
Stickers & Adhesive Gems	Great for decorating crafts and practicing precision.
